### STEEL: THE REGION'S LEGACY INDUSTRY



Steel mills have been a driving force behind Northwest Indiana's economy for over 100 years. From Inland Steel's Indiana Harbor plant to the last integrated steel mill built

in the U.S. at Burns Harbor, the Region's connection to the steel industry has brought a lot of growth, a lot of development, and a lot of controversy.

On July 8, the Westchester Township History Museum will open a new exhibit that looks back at the 122-year history of steel in the Region and its impact on local towns, the economy, population growth, and transportation. Visitors will be able to see photographs and maps from early mills in East Chicago and Gary, and view some of the artifacts from the Museum collection as well as some on loan from the Northwest Indiana Steel Heritage Group. Visitors can also check out a 4-foot-long wrench and see for themselves how difficult it must be to work with these giant tools.

Steel: The Region's Legacy Industry will run through the end of the year. The Museum is open Wednesday 12 – 5 PM, the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of every month from 12 – 5 PM, or by appointment. Call 219-983-9715 for more information.












## Meet the Author: **Tyrone McKinley Freeman**


Join Westchester Township History Museum staff to learn about the history of downtown Chesterton and some of its most unique and historic buildings and houses.

Walking and standing required. Water bottle, hat, and sunscreen recommended. Tour lasts approximately 90 minutes.








- 1. Use your Library card to place holds (online or by phone) for up to 5 DVDs and 10 other items per card, based on the following item limits: 5 DVDs, 10 Music CDs, 5 New Books, 2 Electronic Games, 10 General Books.
- 2. After you receive notice that your holds are ready, drive to your branch during Curbside Pickup hours. Pull into a specially-numbered parking space.
- 3. Call the Library phone number posted on the numbered parking space sign and staff will check-out and bring your holds to your parking space.
- 4. TWO options for pickup! Staff will place your holds on the table attached to your parking space for you to get, OR, pop your trunk and staff will place your holds inside the trunk and will then close it for you.
- 5. Pull out and enjoy your Library materials!
