IN THE "SPIRIT" OF HALLOWEEN

Westchester Township History Museum staff are often asked if the Brown Mansion is haunted. While none of the current staff have had any ghostly encounters at the Museum, there are reasons to believe that it *might* be haunted.

Several people who lived or visited here as children claimed to see a ghost sitting on the stairs. The children called the ghost "Ebbie," short for Ebenezer, but as far as we know, there was never anyone named Ebenezer who lived here.

We have also had several ghost hunters come through the Brown Mansion. Many of

these groups have reported electronically recorded sounds that are interpreted to be spirit voices.

If it is haunted, who would be haunting it? It could be the spirits of the people who died here. George Brown, his wife, Charity, and their 19-year-old son, Charles, all died in the house and had their funerals in the parlor. This was common practice in Chesterton until the early 20th century.

When the Brown Mansion was built in 1885, ghost stories, séances, and mediums were popular throughout the U.S. But Halloween was not the time for such things. During the Victorian Era, Christmas was the most popular time to tell ghost stories (think about Charles Dickens's *A Christmas Carol)*. The Chesterton Tribune even reported on several ghost sightings around the area in the 1890s.

It is possible that the Brown family may have told such stories or held séances in the house. We do not know. Despite ghost hunters' indications that there are spirits here, and former residents reported seeing seeing ghosts, if there *are* ghosts in the house, they leave us alone to do our work.
