A WINDOW INTO CHRISTMAS PAST

Have you ever wondered what Christmas was like in America long ago? In the late 1890s to around 1910, your town square would have had a magnificent tree lit by the newly-invented electric lamps. Christmas decorations would have been sold at both the General Store and the Toy Store. Shop windows would be decorated, highlighting the craftsmanship or wares of the artisan, like the baker, butcher, or printers who made Christmas cards to send near and far.

But the Toy Store's window was the most spectacular of all. It showcased an variety of mezmerizing things that elicited oohs and ahs from the crowds who gathered.

The Hageman Library has some of these treasures on display so that you almost imagine that you are peering into one such window. The decorations, from Germany, include:

- Beautiful glass Kugels, which is German for ball or sphere; these ornaments are lined with silvered glass.
- A mechanical Santa pulling a jumping Jack out of his pack.
- A provincial Sebnitz ornament of a horse pulling a wagon.
- A Dresden elephant sporting a colorful howdah, a bluebird on a branch with leaves, and two silver sleighs, one pulled by reindeer, the other by swans.
- The most splendid item of all is a German Kalliope music box and Christmas tree stand. It holds a feather tree that would rotate while a metal cylinder played music when it was wound.

These are just a few of the wonders waiting to be discovered. A Window into Christmas Past will be on display December 5 through January 15, 2025.






- 1. Use your Library card to place holds (online or by phone) for up to 5 DVDs and 10 other items per card, based on the following item limits: 5 DVDs, 10 Music CDs, 5 New Books, 2 Electronic Games, 10 General Books.
- 2. After you receive notice that your holds are ready, drive to your branch during Curbside Pickup hours. Pull into a specially-numbered parking space.
- 3. Call the Library phone number posted on the numbered parking space sign and staff will check-out and bring your holds to your parking space.
- 4. TWO options for pickup! Staff will place your holds on the table attached to your parking space for you to get, OR, pop your trunk and staff will place your holds inside the trunk and will then close it for you.
- 5. Pull out and enjoy your Library materials!


