## WOMEN'S HISTORY

Sometimes, the only way to find information on women is to get help. Contact a library, museum, archive, or historical society in the town/county where they lived. The Westchester Township History Museum offers assistance in locating these institutions and finding obscure records. For local women, check out our Women's History Month posts on Facebook or look through the family histories and records at the Museum.

Do you have blanks in your family tree for your female ancestors? If so, you're not alone. Researching women in the U.S., especially before the 20th century, can be difficult due to social and political norms that excluded women from official records. If you are having trouble, consider using Ancestry Library Edition available at all WPL sites or visit the Museum for assistance.

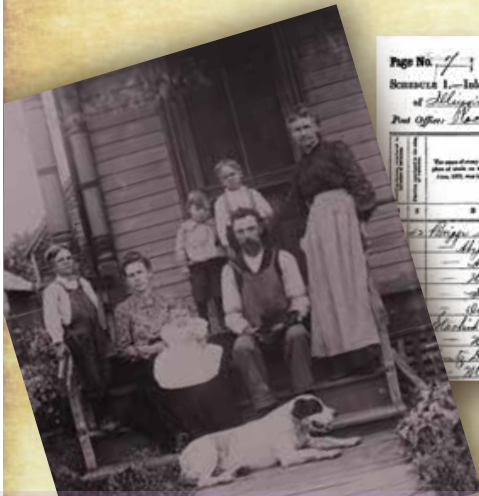
Ancestry Library Edition gives you access to U.S. records, including immigration records, as well as international records. However, it is important to know which records are actually available for women. For example, prior to the 1930s, women's citizenship was reliant on their husband's or father's status, so many immigrant women did not have individual records. Wills, bank records, and land records were also limited for women until they achieved the right to own and control property, and those dates depend on their state residency.

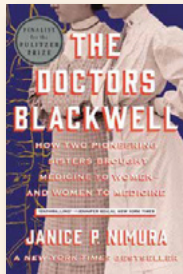

### *The Doctors Blackwell* by Janice Nimura

Elizabeth Blackwell believed from an early age that she was destined for a mission beyond the scope of "ordinary" womanhood. In 1849, she became the first woman in America to receive an M.D. She was soon joined in her achievement by her younger sister, Emily. Together, the Blackwells founded the New York Infirmary for Indigent Women and Children, the first hospital staffed entirely by women. From Bristol, Paris, and Edinburgh to the rising cities of antebellum America, this richly researched new biography celebrates two complicated pioneers who exploded the limits of possibility for women in medicine.


## ***How Railways Transformed the World* (DVD)**




